Village of Schoharie Water System Improvements Project Meeting Report – May 18, 2022 I. Project Update

A. We had the Contract No. 1 pre-construction meeting with DN Tanks on May 12. Sitework is not expected to start until July. CSP staff continues to be very cooperative. B. The results were received from the first and second rounds of spring supply water testing.

II. Next Steps

- A. Lamont to review material and product submittals from DN Tanks as they are received (starting by June 1 or sooner).
- B. CSP and DN Tanks will be developing a site-specific safety plan to address CSP access requirements.
- C. Now that we have a contractor and a construction schedule, I will track down the Town CEO to obtain the building permit for the tank.
- D. DPW staff to continue the baseline water quality testing of spring supply (for Clean-Flo aeration system design).
- E. Lamont will need to draft an engineering contract amendment to cover our ongoing services for consideration in June. As a reminder, our work started with an initial contract amount that was only a portion of the total amount budgeted.

III. Other Projects

- A. WWTP Compliance Schedule On April 26, DEC asked about the Village's efforts toward compliance and, after discussing with Ken, I responded that the Board was going to consider purchasing the new meter at this meeting. I suggest that the Board move ahead with this soon, so that the operators have the summer/fall disinfection season to determine if the existing chemical feed systems can suitably de-chlorinate the wastewater.
- B. Bridge/Main St. Sidewalk Curb Ramps The submitted Concept Plan seems OK with DOT and they suggested we move forward with design; we are planning to collect the needed field data next week in conjunction with Ken to help minimize costs.
- C. Downtown Parking Lot: Sue Anacker should be finishing up her research by the end of this week.

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
