Meeting Report – October 19, 2022

I. Project Update

A. DN Tanks still owes us some minor product submittals to make (electrical components, etc.). All significant submittals have been reviewed and approved.

B. Tweedie Construction is expected to mobilize and start "roughing-out" the tank sitework on or about November 1.

C. DN Tank's Pay Application #1 was submitted and disbursed with drawdown request #7 to EFC.

D. The final design of the Holding Pond aeration system is 95% done.

II. Next Steps

A. Lamont will continue to review the remaining submittals from DN Tanks as they arrive.
B. I will update Ken, the Board, and CSP once Tweedie's mobilization and sitework schedule is confirmed.

C. DN Tanks and Tweedie will coordinate with CSP at mobilization to finalize any site specific Safety measures needed relative to the CSP access requirements.

D.The design of the Holding Pond aeration system will be submitted to DOH for approval next week. Ideally, we'll be able to get this out to bid before the snow flies so the bidders can get a good look at the site.

III. Other Projects

A. Bridge/Main St. Sidewalk Curb Ramps – When would the Village like to bid this work? Spring 2023? We can assist if needed.

B. South End Drainage/Trail – Jodie and Ken met with Mr. Mc Fee on September 29. I understand that he was more concerned with low water conditions than with high water. His biggest concerns were with the foot traffic from the proposed trail and the impacts to his "adopted" lawn at the pond site, which is owned by the Village.

C. WWTP SPDES Compliance – Another 9-month update report is due to DEC on November 1; I will work with Ken next week to get DEC an update.
