RCAP Solutions is federally funded to help small communities through three primary sources, the USDA, EPA and Department of Health & Human Services. They have six regional offices and offer technical assistance advisors. They are currently working with DPW on the NYS Lead Line Survey project but offer many other aides including water/sewer pricing, GIS mapping, water and sewer educational classes, improve regulatory compliance and system sustainability, document income eligibility for funding programs and many other services.
